Show Rules and Entry Forms

THIS IS AN OPEN KOI SHOW - ENGLISH STYLE JUDGING - ACCEPTING ALL HOBBYIST ENTRIES - DEALER OWNED KOI WILL NOT BE ALLOWED - THE KOI'S OWNER MUST BE PRESENT AT CHECK IN TO SIGN THE OFFICIAL REGISTRATION FORM.

THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THE RULES THAT ARE LISTED BELOW, WHICH WILL BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO.

- Registration (deadline by August 15th, 2024) entry fee: 6' tank \$60.00, 8' tank \$75.00. Make checks payable to NMZNA and mail with a copy of the signed, **Show Tank Reservation Form** and the **Koi Show Entry Form** to the Club Treasurer or use Venmo.
- > Due to the currently limited show tank space at our host facility, and the number of hobbyists wanting to enter, only one (1) tank per hobbyist will be allowed first come, first served. This rule relaxed IF extra display space is created. Waitlist for extra tanks.
- ➤ Koi husbandry is a very large part of the hobby. How the koi are cared for is critical and related to how the fish develops over time and its condition at the time it is entered into the show. In support of this, only fish that have been brought to the show from the owner's pond can be entered into the koi show. Exception: fish purchased at the show only size 1 and 2 can be entered into the koi show with registration by 10am Saturday morning.
- Show vat "Fish Load" chart will be strictly enforced. See separate sheet included. This is a revised sheet with updates for sizing.
- > Refrain from feeding fish for at least five days prior to the show. This is critical to the health and welfare of your koi. Water quality is difficult to maintain if your fish are littering the bottom of the tank with waste. A dirty tank also presents a negative image to the judges and viewing public.
- We ask that every attempt be made to ensure fish be checked in and benched between 12 Noon and 5:00 p.m. (CDT) on Friday. Fish check-in will be permitted after 5:00 p.m. by pre-arrangement ONLY. All fish must be checked in and benched by 10 a.m. on Saturday. Participants are required to bring their own blue show bowl and koi net. The Club will supply show tank covers.
- > The Benching Committee reserves the right to reject fish of questionable health from participation.
- All fish entered will be benched at show site for proper classification and length. If necessary, fish measurements and classification corrections will be made by the judging committee.

- > Past Champions Once a koi (A and B) has been awarded Grand Champion at an NMZNA show, the Grand Champion fish is not eligible to compete the following year but is eligible any year after that.
- Class "A" will include Kohaku, Sanke, Showa and all Utsurimono. Gin Rin types of these varieties will be benched as Gin Rin "A".
- Baby Champion is from Sizes 1 & 2, Young Champion is from sizes 3 & 4, Ault Champion is from Sizes 5 & 6, and Mature Champion is from Sizes 7 & 8. Please advise benching team to register a koi for Best Male category.
- > Prior to show check-in, each entrant will be assigned a number corresponding to his/her show tank.
- Fish will be handled during the show BY AUTHORIZED SHOW PERSONNEL ONLY.
- In accordance with ZNA rules, koi dealers or their immediate family members are not allowed to enter fish.
- > It is our intent that judging will begin at 10:00 AM on Saturday. Participants are asked to refrain from holding conversations with the judges until the Koi Show Chairman has announced that the judging has been completed and all the decisions are final.
- Only authorized personnel determined by the Koi Show Chairman will be allowed with the judges during the judging of the koi.
 This will be adhered to strictly and NO EXCEPTIONS ALLOWED.
- > Every necessary and reasonable precaution will be taken by the Koi Show Chairman, the benching staff, the water quality chairman, and the judging team to ensure the safety and welfare of all fish on exhibit. Therefore, all participants in the show will agree to hold the clubs, its officers, and members blameless against any loss or injury of fish.
- > Any contingencies not covered in these rules will be subject to the decision of the Koi Show Committee.
- > Any club wanting to present a Friendship Award will complete and turn in the form available at the show by 3 p.m. Saturday.
- > The KOI SHOW concludes at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday. Anyone traveling over 200 miles may check out at 12:00 p.m. (CDT) on Sunday. **NO EARLY CHECK-OUT EXCEPTIONS!**

Entries are accepted with the understanding that the participant agrees to hold the Clubs, Club Officers, Club Directors, NMZNA and GKPC members, Timberwinds Nursery and its employees harmless against any loss or injury to the fish.

NEW STANDARD POINT SYSTEM

FOR DETERMINING SHOW VAT LOAD

Please use the following point system as a guide in determining how many koi can be placed in a six or eight foot show vat. Exhibitors will not be allowed to exceed the point maximums.

Determine the total number of points in your vat by adding the points assigned to each fish by using this guideline. Fish are measured from the tip of the nose to the end of the tail.

Size 1, up to 7.9'' (20 cm) = 0.3 point

Size 2, up to 11.8'' (30 cm) = 1 point

Size 3, up to 15.7'' (40 cm) = 2 points

Size 4, up to 19.7'' (50 cm) = 5 points

Size 5, up to 23.6'' (60 cm) = 8 points

Size 6, up to 27.6'' (70 cm) = 12 points

Size 7, up to 31.5'' (80 cm) = 16 points

Size 8, over 31.5''(80+cm) = 20 points

The recommended total points for six and eight foot vats is as follows:

Six foot vat – optimum is 20 points, maximum is 25 points

Eight foot vat – optimum is 35 points, maximum is 45 points

If your total points exceed the above maximum points, you will be required to reduce the total load number by renting another vat, if one is available, or taking some fish home. The water quality team cannot risk the health of your koi due to overstocking.
